Common types include:

Voice Cloning: Mimicking someone's voice to request urgent money transfers.


Deepfakes: Fake videos of people saying or doing things they never did.

Warning Signs

- Unusual requests using familiar voices.
- "Too perfect" emails or messages.
- Urgency combined with secrecy ("Don't tell anyone,
