Deepfake Job Scams

Scammers are posting fake job listings on popular job boards and setting up interviews to steal personal information from job seekers. The scams are meticulously set up, from a perfect replica website to a deepfake interviewer. It can be hard to identify scam interviews when a deepfake video is used.

These scams are designed to obtain personal information that is typically provided when someone is hired. This can include bank information for direct deposit, a driver's license, Social Insurance Number, and other relevant documents. They use this information to create fake IDs for sale or to steal a person's identity.

How to Identify Deepfakes

Deepfake videos, especially live calls, are often shaky, and the face moves unnaturally. Sometimes the voice won't match what the lips are saying, or the eyes might move in odd ways, or remain still for a long period without blinking. The video may evoke a uncanny valley feeling, which can be caused by inconsistent shadows and lighting, or blurry edges around the
